



## Cabinet OKs `3,300-cr chip assembly plant in Gujarat

India has ambitions to become a major chip hub on the lines of the United States, Taiwan and South Korea, and has been courting foreign companies to set up operations in the country.

The Union Cabinet Monday cleared a semiconductor assembly and testing plant being set up by Kaynes Semicon at a cost of `3,300 crore. This is the fifth semiconductor unit, and the fourth assembly unit, to receive Cabinet approval under India's ambitious `76,000 crore chip manufacturing incentive scheme.

"The capacity of this unit will be 60 lakh chips per day... The chips produced in this unit will cater to a wide variety of applications which include segments such as industrial, automotive, electric vehicles, consumer electronics, telecom, mobile phones, etc." the Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY) said in a statement.

"Yet another boost to India's efforts towards becoming a hub for semiconductors...

This will cater to a wide range of sectors and also give employment to several youth," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on X.

The plant will be constructed in Sanand, Gujarat. It is understood that the plant was initially to come up in <u>Telangana</u>, but was moved to Gujarat, after the government indicated that Sanand was coming up as a cluster for chip assembly plants. It is also learnt that the government's subsidy towards the plant will be around `1,300 crore.
